Before that, she worked in Washington, D.C. as Media Unite Chief for the Bureau of Consular Affairs where she oversaw press and public messaging on visas and immigration policy from 2016-2018.

From 2014-2016, Virginia worked in the Bureau of African Affairs as the Zimbabwe desk officer. She has also served overseas in Paramaribo, Suriname, as Public Affairs Officer, in
